Chapter Four

The Amnesty of Giggles

- It lowers cortisol, dissolving stress as surely as sunlight melts frost.
- It increases oxygen intake, invigorating the blood and waking the cells.
- It lights up the brain's reward pathways, those same shimmering corridors that open in love, music, and spiritual awe.

To laugh is to heal—not symbolically, but chemically, neurologically, physically. When you laugh, your immune system perks up, your heart relaxes, your breath deepens. Every giggle is medicine, microdosing joy straight into the bloodstream.

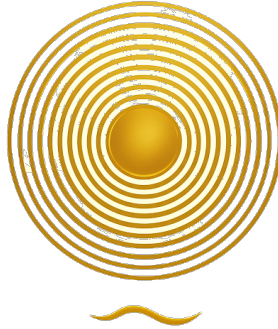
